ANTICIPATION

- Studentfeelsoverwhelmed
- Studentsexperiencedisappointment related to unmetexpectations and concerns about their performance.
- · Buildafoundationofrapportandtrust.
- Supervisors should identify realistic, clear, specific goals and expectations for the student to help reduce anxiety.
- Learningyourstudentslearningstylewillbe beneficial

DISILLUSIONMENT

- Studentfeelsoverwhelmed
- Studentsexperiencedisappointmentrelated tounmetexpectationsandconcernsabout theirperformance.
- Supervisorsshouldacknowledge, clarify, and normalize the gaps between student expectations and reality.

CONFRONTATION

- Studentsmustconfrontthemselves(asking forhelp,beinganadultlearner,or temperingpiecesoftheirpersonality,etc.)
- Supervisorscansupportstudentsin confrontingthemselvesbyrecognizingthat thisisanormaldevelopmentalstageand initiatingdiscussionaboutwhatthestudent maybe experiencing.

COMPETENCE

- Studentsbegintofeelcapable,canaccept greaterresponsibilities,haveasenseof autonomyandpurpose.
- Studentsfeelacknowledgedandrespected bytheirfieldinstructor,coworkers,and clients.
- Studentsexperienceself-determinationand self-actualization.
- Supervisionbecomes more of a mentoring relationship, so more interpersonal and consultative in nature.
- The supervisor can focus on coaching the student forgeneral professional success at this point as opposed to strictly task management and basic skill development.

CULMINATION

- Termination
- Studentsredefinetheirrelationships withclients, supervisors, and coworkers.
- Studentscoulddisengageearlyas theyplanforthefuture.

- Goodbyesingeneralaredifficult, but studentsmayneedsupportinterminating with clients in an appropriate manner.
- Opendialogaboutandpreparationforthe placementconcludingisthebestsupporta supervisorcanprovideastudentduringthis stage.
